The key priority of the NI Community Relations Council (NICRC) is the health and well-being of those we work with, our staff and their families. You will all be aware of the recent change to the government's guidance on Covid-19. Below we have set out the steps we are taking as a result of the new guidance:

DARE to Connect Safely TIDES Training





In This Together Project Rural Community Network




The Rural Community Network (RCN), who are core funded by CRC, are delivering a special digital project during the Covid-19 pandemic.


Covid-19 and Young People Springboard

Springboard Opps, who are core funded by the NI Community Relations Council, created a video to capture what young people were feeling while living through lockdown.
