

Introduction

The forthcoming period 2011 – 2022 marks a number of significant political events which have shaped the sense of British and Irish identity in Northern Ireland in the 20th century. It is a decade of ideas.

The Community Relations Council and Heritage Lottery Fund from late 2010 began to work in partnership in order to stimulate a conversation which seeks to raise the issue of remembering in public space and perhaps to promote a process that leads to the development of practice models and principles. - 2 Recognise the implications and **consequences** of what happened;
- 3 Understand that different **perceptions** and interpretations exist; and
- 4 Show how events and activities can deepen **understanding** of the period.
- 5 All to be seen in the context of an 'inclusive and accepting society'
